

COUNTY ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, by House Bill No. 652 of the General Assembly of North Carolina, enacted at the regular session of 1945 and by Section 2 of the said Act, the Board of Surry County was authorized to regulate or prohibit the sale of wine within that part of Mount Airy Township outside the corporate limits of the Town of Mount Airy:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SURRY COUNTY IN REGULAR MEETING HELD ON THIS THE 7TH DAY OF MAY 1945.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell wine, or wines, within that part of Mount Airy Township, Surry County, North Carolina, which lies outside of the Corporate limits of the Town of Mount Airy and within said Mount Airy Township.

SECTION 2. This resolution and ordinance shall be effective upon the passage of this resolution, provided, however, that in keeping with Public-Local law above referred to, all persons, firms and corporations shall have thirty days from the date of the passage of this resolution in which to dispose of and sell wine on hand.

SECTION 3. Any license issued to any person, firm or corporation for the sale of wine now on hand by such person, firm or corporation shall be issued with the express understanding that such license will be null and void after thirty days from the date hereof, notwithstanding the fact that same on its face may appear to be an annual license.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this resolution, or the Public-Local Act above referred to, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction or plea of guilty shall be punished in the discretion of the court, as set forth in said act.

The foregoing resolution duly adopted by unanimous vote of the Board of Commissioners.
