

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO NAME PUBLIC ROADS WITHIN SURRY COUNTY WITHIN THE DELIVERY AREA OF THE MOUNT AIRY, NORTH CAROLINA, POST OFFICE (NOT WITHIN THE CITY OF MOUNT AIRY) AND THE ASSIGNMENT OF STREET NUMBERS FOR USE ON SUCH ROADS.

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statutes 153A-240 provides that a county may by ordinance name or rename any public road within the county and not within a city, and may assign or reassign street numbers for use on such a road; and

WHEREAS, there was a public hearing held in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Surry County Courthouse, Dobson, North Carolina, on May 19, 1986, at which time the public sentiment for the naming of roads and a numbering system for roads was overwhelmingly in favor of such procedure and action by the Board of County Commissioners of Surry County; and

WHEREAS, petitions filed with the Commissioners and the County Manager have indicated overwhelming public support in favor of the naming of the roads and a numbering system for the roads; and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners of Surry County have determined that it is appropriate and will be helpful to and in the best interest of the citizens of Surry County within the delivery area of the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office and will be helpful to the expeditious dispatching of and providing of emergency services within the county; and

WHEREAS, the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office of the United States Postal Service has in use a map of the streets and roads (outside the City of Mount Airy) on which map the roads are named and numbers are assigned for use on such roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Surry County deem it appropriate and in the best interest of the citizens and property owners in Surry County within the delivery area of the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office that the map and the roads as named and shown on said map and numbers assigned for use on such roads by the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office, be adopted by Surry County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Surry County Board of Commissioners enacts and ordains:

Section 1. The public roads located in the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office delivery area (outside the City of Mount Airy) are hereby assigned the names as shown on that certain map prepared by the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office, which map dated June 10, 1986, is on file in the office of the County Manager of Surry County and is incorporated herein by reference, with the following changes to said map:

1. Culler Road shall be named Old Creed Road.
2. Gene Jackson Road shall be named Chestnut Ridge.
3. Prison Camp Road shall remain unofficially named pending a survey of property owners to determine their preferences as to road name.

Section 2. The numbering system assigned to the named roads on the map furnished by the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office on file in the office of the County Manager of Surry County is adopted as the numbering system for said roads as shown on said map dated June 10, 1986, which is on file in the office of the County Manager of Surry County and is incorporated herein by reference. The numbering system that the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office from time to time adopts and assignment of the numbers to the various residences is adopted for a numbering system of roads as the same is adopted and used by the Mount Airy, North Carolina, Post Office.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective this June 2, 1986.
