— **Rural Development:** Boosting small towns and communities through better connections can create strong local economies and help them to be successful.

— **Knowledge-Based Workforce:** Developing more travel options for a knowledge-based workforce made up of jobs requiring higher education can allow North Carolina to attract new companies.

— **Goods Delivery:** Increasing the amount of goods that trucks, trains, ships, and airplanes can move from factories to homes, schools and jobs will benefit the state's economy.

— **Connecting Seniors:** Providing reliable and lower-cost travel options can connect seniors to healthcare and other needs.

— **Self-Driving Cars:** Self-driving cars and connected cars (cars that "talk" to each other and the roadway) can provide more convenient and safe travel options.

— **Weather Preparedness:** Planning for extreme weather events can provide reliable and safe travel options when people need them most.

— **Core Industry Access:** Improving access to healthcare, schools, farming and tourism can support growth and improve life for North Carolina's residents.
