The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Administration in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2014-2015 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2014. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

**The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:**

Home Based Family Services	Mentoring	Interpersonal Skill Building
Parent/Family Skills Classes	Emergency Shelter Care	Tutoring/Academic Enhancement
Restitution/Community Service	Counseling (Individual and Family)	
Anger Management Classes	Cognitive Behavioral Groups	

**Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:**

Adjudicated youth with: peer relationship issues or associate with delinquent youth, have moderate to serious school behavioral problems, some substance use or abuse, are in need of further assessment or treatment, have had prior adjudications and have parent who have problems with providing adequate levels of supervision.

**Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:**

Peer Domain: Adjudicated youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent peers or are gang members.  
Individual Domain: Adjudicated are victims of abuse/neglect, who may or may not have needed support, who are in need mental health.  
Family Domain: Adjudicated youth who have parents who have marginal parenting skills, reside in homes with domestic discord, have alcohol or drug abuse or have family members with a criminal history.  
School Domain: Adjudicated or at risk youth who have multiple unexcused absences, short term or long term suspensions, who are excelled or who have school disciplinary problems.

**Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:**

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
