



Case Update:

Surry County now has 135 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 1 COVID-19 related death. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has defined recovery from COVID-19 as resolution of fever without the use of fever reducing medications with progressive improvement or resolution of other symptoms. According to this definition, Surry County has 63 recoveries.

Weekly Updates:

- On May 22, 2020 at 5 pm, North Carolina will move to a modified Phase 2 of gradual re-opening. The Stay at Home Order has been lifted and replaced by a Safer at Home recommendation.
- Changes in Phase 2 include:
 - Gatherings of no more than 10 people indoors and no more than 25 people outdoors.
 - Restaurants, salons, and barbers can accept customers indoors with limited capacity and cleaning and cloth face covering requirements.
 - Overnight and day camps can open with expanded safety rules.
 - Bars, gyms, nightclubs, indoor entertainment venues, and public playgrounds remain closed.
 - Pools may open with certain requirements in place.
 - Restrictions still in place for congregate living facilities.

Protective Measures:

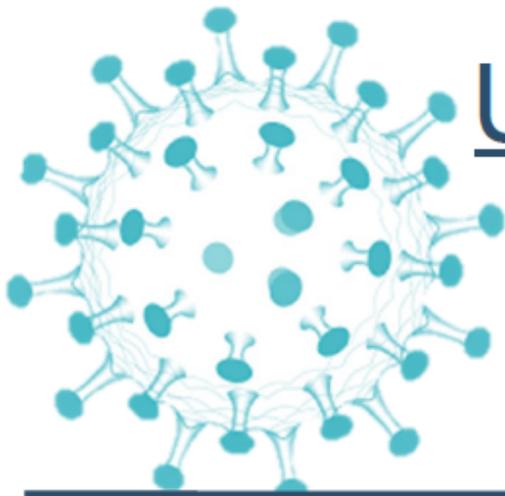
In order to further protect yourselves and your loved ones, we would like to remind you to:

- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.

- Cover your cough and sneezes with a tissue and dispose of the tissue.
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects daily (e.g., tables, countertops, cell phones, computers, light switches, doorknobs, and handles) using a household detergent and water.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, and if your hands are not visibly dirty use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- CDC recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies), **especially** in areas of significant community-based transmission
 - Cloth face coverings (not surgical masks or N95 respirators) should:
 - fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
 - be secured with ties or ear loops
 - include multiple layers of fabric
 - allow for breathing without restriction
 - be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape
